More information from our Superintendent, Mr Thompson....

<u>Elementary Fundraiser Delivery:</u> Elementary students at Jackson and Ponca Elementary schools conducted a fundraising project to raise funds to support their annual Spring field trips. Profits from this effort will be distributed to each grade level based upon the amount of items sold.

Products sold by students will be delivered on Monday, March 22nd. Delivery is scheduled for the Jackson Elementary gymnasium at 2:00pm, and at the Ponca_Elementary East gym at 2:30pm. Products sold by students will be bulk-packaged with the student/sellers name on the package label. Starting at 3:00pm at both sites, students and parents should be able to pick up their sale items prior to going home at the end of the day on Monday. Students should plan to deliver sales products to individual buyers on Monday evening. A number of items will be delivered frozen, so delivery to buyers should be made as soon as possible.

Parental assistance is encouraged to assist students to pick up and help deliver the products. Students who sold a large number of items may not be able to carry items home with them after school, or get them all on the bus. Parents, please make arrangements with, and for, your child to assist them.


At the end of the sale period in February, students were able to indicate where they wanted their items delivered, for ease of pick up. Students who live in the Jackson area, even though they attend school in Ponca, could choose to have their products delivered to <u>Jackson Elementary</u> for pick up. The same for Ponca are students who attend Jackson Elementary but want to pick up their items in Ponca.

<u>Summer Driver Education Sign-up:</u> Driver Education classes will be held at Ponca School starting in June after school is out. The cost of the class is \$185.00 for students who are residents of the Ponca school District, and \$250.00, for non-resident students. Residence is determined by domicile of the parent with primary custody. Exact dates of the class will be determined at a later date.

Requirements in order to register to take Driver education for the summer of 2010:

- 1. Enrollment maximum of thirty (30) students.
- 2. Class sign up sheet located in the High School Principal's Office. Sign up by May 1st.
- 3. At time of enrollment, must pay \$92.50 as deposit for taking class. Remainder due the first day of class.
- 4. Must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2010.
- 5. Must be eligible for a Learner's Permit.
- 6. Oldest students on sign-up sheet will be given preference to take class.
- 7. Signing up after May 1st, will put your name on the bottom of the list, regardless of age.

Mr. Dan Loofe will once again be the instructor for the class.

The 2010 Dixon County Health Fair will be held at the Ponca Public School on Wednesday, March, 17, 2010. The Health Fair will begin at 1:00 p.m. Secondary students from Wakefield, Newcastle, Allen and Ponca will rotate through four sessions centered on topics for teenagers. The 2010 teen topics are—Teen Dating, Sexually Transmitted Diseases, and Nutrition and Stress. Students in grades 3-6 will participate in a Health Carnival and special activities for elementary students from 1:00-3:30. The public is invited to attend any or all of the events at the health fair. The health fair is scheduled from 1:00-5:00 p.m. Programming from 3:00-5:00 is especially for seniors and families.

Pre-registration for the 2010-11 school year will take place at Ponca School in March. Students in grades 8-11 will begin the process at school. Students then will bring their pre-registration forms home to be reviewed by their parents. Parents are asked to sign the form and the student is to return it to school. It is important that students take the pre-registration seriously as the schedule for next year is created from the students' selections.

Parent Teacher Conferences for students in grades 3-12 are scheduled for Ponca School on March 18, from 2:00-8:00 p.m. Conferences are an important means of keeping in touch with your child's school progress. We look forward to seeing you at conferences!

These tests are very important for two reasons: the test will measure your child's ability compared with other students through out the country and help the school compare how we are doing compared with other schools. It is important your child gets plenty of rest before and during the testing schedule. Children should eat a good breakfast to give them a good start to the day.

Parent- teacher conferences are scheduled for March 25th. A schedule will be sent home with your child. Report cards for the 3rd quarter can be picked up at parent- teacher conferences. Please be on time for your appointment and be prepared with questions you might have for the teacher. Remember your appointment is 10 minutes, please be prepared!

The deadline for open enrollment forms is March 15th. The forms must be in the superintendent's office by March 15th if you wish to open enroll your child into the Ponca School District. Open enrollment is determined on an individual basis and not according to families.

We are still having problems with parents entering the building before school is dismissed. This is a very busy time of the day for students and teachers and sometimes chaotic. Teachers are trying to separate students into bus rider groups, parent pickup groups and walking home students. Please wait for your child outside the building to ease some of the congestion!

It's time to start thinking about Pre-school. The Pre-school open house will be Tuesday, April 20th at 6:00pm.

Attention Seniors....College Immunization Info.

Attention Senior Parents,

Your child will soon be graduating and several students will be heading off to college in the fall. This is a perfect time to make sure your child's immunizations are current. The two vaccines that are recommended at this age are:

- 1.) <u>A tetanus booster (Td)</u>- which contains tetanus and diphtheria. Bacteria cause both tetanus and diphtheria. Tetanus enters the body through cuts or wounds, where diphtheria is spread from person to person.
- 2.) <u>Meningococcal Vaccine</u>-meningococcal disease is a serious illness, caused by bacteria. It is the leading cause of bacterial meningitis in children 2-18 years old. Meningitis is an infection of fluid surrounding the brain and spinal cord. Anyone can get meningococcal disease, although college freshmen that live in dormitories are at higher risk of obtaining it.

Many colleges require these vaccines prior to entrance. I strongly recommend your child receive these vaccines, even if they aren't required.

Test Taking Success!

Just hearing the word, "TEST", could send anyone into an anxiety attack. Tests are a fact of life. While your child may never like to take tests you can help him/her do their best.

Your child will be tested throughout the school year on skills that he/she has learned in order to meet classroom, district, state, and/or national standards. This year the ITBS (Iowa Tests of Basic Skills) standardized tests will be given to students in grades 2-6, 7, 8, 9 and 11, the week of March 1-5.

Standardized tests measure your child's performance, or how well they are learning in different subject areas. The test results will give information about your child's strengths and weaknesses in each subject area.

The following are some strategies to help your child be successful not only on the ITBS tests, but also on various tests given throughout the school year.

- Make sure your child has a regular bedtime to allow an adequate amount of sleep each night. This is especially important before taking a test.
- Provide your child with a healthy breakfast to provide energy for his/her brain and body.
- Make sure your child arrives at school on time every day.
- Encourage your child to complete and hand in daily homework assignments-Practice makes progress. We can encourage children to study and practice so they can do their best, just as we encourage them to practice a musical instrument or sports skill, so they can do well at a recital or on game day.
- Study day-by-day. DON'T CRAM! Studies show that most people remember facts better when they review and repeat them in several short segments over time, rather than trying to cram a lot of information in one longer session the day before or the day of the test.
- Provide a consistent place and time at home for your child to complete homework.
- Encourage your child, before bedtime, to gather and put in his/her book bag all homework and materials needed at school the next day. Have your child place his/her book bag in a certain spot in his/her room or by the front door, so he/she can grab the bag easily when leaving for school.

The best way to help your child do his/her best on homework and tests is to provide positive support by expressing confidence in your child's ability to do his/her best. Try to provide a calm, stress-free environment each morning as your child gets ready for school. Get up in plenty of time to avoid morning rush and anxiety. If you know your child is going to take a test try to curtail nighttime extra-curricular activities and outings that may interfere with their regular routine.

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL

PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS
WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTIONS
FOR THE 2010 – 2011 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2010 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2010-2011 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before **March 15** shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before **March 15** shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.
