From the Desk of the Superintendent

Winter Weather - School Cancellation - For many of us, the winter of 2009-10 is still too vivid in our memory. Multiple storms, drifts blocking roads, cancelled school days were all part of a lengthy season that seemed like it would never end. Now, here we are again, Thanksgiving only a few weeks away, and Christmas at seven and one-half weeks. We have had an exceptionally nice October, but as we approach the middle portion of our school year, weather plays a factor in our daily routine and schedule. Thus, it is essential that we pass along the following information to you.

It is important that we remind everyone about winter weather and the need to stay informed about possible school closings, delays, or early dismissals. There are many factors to be considered before making this decision. First, and foremost, is the safety of students, faculty, staff, and parents.

Prior to 6:00 a.m., a decision will be made whether to cancel school, or to start late for the day. Information is entered online. The relevant information for our school district is released from there to area radio and television stations. This information will also be available to our school district patrons online. You can access this by going to the school district's website www.poncaschool.org, click on the "SnowCap - Closings/Delays" button on the left side of the front page. This will let you see what decision has been made for Ponca Schools. This same information will be scrolling along the top of the District's webpage.

There are occasions when the weather patterns and forecasts are clearly obvious that a decision can be made the night before. When this happens, the online process will begin to air the announcement on the 10 o'clock news. However, this may not always be possible. Should the decision be made to start school late, this will always be a two (2) hour late start. Classes will start in Jackson and Ponca two (2) hours later than their normal starting time. Buses will run their regular routes, but will be two (2) hours later than normal.

Occasionally, weather conditions will deteriorate during the school day to a point where early dismissal is necessary. We will try to avoid early dismissal if possible because contacting parents is difficult. Parents may, during inclement weather, pick up your child/children at your own discretion. Please make arrangements for the care of your child in case an early dismissal is necessary. In case of the early dismissal, all activity practices will be cancelled.

WINTER WEATHER INFORMATION CONTINUED...

Following are some helpful hints as parents prepare:

- Know your bus route. Know who is picked up or dropped off before and after your stop. Contact other bus patrons on your route for information regarding the location of the bus.
- If you are going to be gone from home and the weather looks questionable, make arrangements for your child to have a neighbor or someone to meet your child, especially younger children.
- Please do not call the school or administration to find out if school is cancelled. Please listen, watch or check online for announcements.
- Parents have the right to make the decision whether to send their children to school when the weather is questionable. If a parent decides that the child will stay home, school work missed will be required to be made up. The child will not be charged with an unexcused absence.

An exceptionally nice feature of this **SNOW-CAP** communication system, is that parents can subscribe to have weather messages sent to home or business email, as well as to your cell phone. There is a place on the **SNOW-CAP** home page, upper right corner, for you to subscribe to the service. This will allow you to get the message regarding school delays, closings, etc., as soon as it is sent out to news organizations.

While students had a day away from school on Friday, October 22, the Ponca School Staff reviewed and were updated on the district evacuation plan. The evacuation plan was then practiced by all students and staff in the district on October 28.

Jackson Elementary News

The first quarter flew by and that means the holiday season is coming up very quickly. It is an exciting time of year.

Parent-teacher's conferences are Thursday, November 4th in Jackson from 4:00pm to 8:00pm. We are asking parents to please be on time for your appointment and remember your allotted time is 10 minutes. If you need more time please make arrangements with the teacher. Make sure you come prepared for conferences, have questions you want to ask written down and make good use of the conference.

The Ponca Indian Football team is enjoying a banner season and marching on to the playoffs. Because of game times beginning in the early afternoon or long distances to travel school could have early dismissals or late starts. Please realize the school does not have much control over the playoff schedule. Please check the school website or notes home from school regarding this information. We will do our best to keep you informed of developments.

With the winter season upon us it is important to be ready for school cancellations, late starts, and early dismissals. Please realize Jackson will follow the Ponca schedule concerning dismissals and cancellations. There will **not** be a separate announcement for Jackson Elementary. If Ponca has a two hour late start, classes in Jackson will begin 15 minutes after the start time in Ponca. Example: Two hour late start in Ponca means school in Ponca will begin at 10:15 which means school in Jackson will begin at 10:30. If there is an early dismissal, Jackson will dismiss 20 minutes before Ponca. Example: If Ponca is dismissing at 1:30, Jackson will dismiss at 1:10.

Another winter weather concern is dressing the students appropriately for winter weather. Please make sure students have a coat, some type of snow pants, gloves, and something to cover their ears. The Ponca/Jackson Elementary will be going outside for recess on most days unless the weather is too severe.

We are having a problem with students wanting to stay in from recess because of illness. We understand there are times when students need to stay inside, but please do not abuse this situation. Studies show the fresh air is good for students; it causes them to be more alert and refreshed. If a student is too ill to go out for recess, they might be too ill to be in school. Students are not required to run at recess, they can do a variety of activities that are not strenuous.

As you know the flu season will be here soon. We have experienced a few incidents already with students coming to school sick. If your child is ill please keep them at home until their fever has gone away and they're symptoms have subsided. We will do everything in our power to combat the flu. We sanitize our lockers, desks, door handles, drinking fountains, and rest rooms routinely. We insist on hand washing often and protect against sharing items as much as possible. Please help by keeping your child home when they are feeling under the weather.

FINE ARTS FUND RAISING "BLITZ"

Exciting things are happening at Ponca Public Schools. On September 15, 2009 the voters of the Ponca School District passed a \$9.52 million bond issue. These are some of the highlights:

- 1st Phase A new Junior and Senior High School will be built across the street to the west of the school joined by a walkway to the 1973 addition. (Washington St. will be closed to all vehicle traffic.) It will also include a new kitchen, library and computer rooms. This phase is to be completed in April 2011.
- 2nd Phase The 1917 addition will be torn down. In its place and in the current green space on the east side of the school will be a new gym and locker rooms, vocal music, janitor rooms, office space and a new commons area connecting the new construction to the 1973 and 1994 additions. The 1939 gym will stay and be remodeled into a band room and theatre area for the performing arts, speech, plays and community musicals.
- The 1973 gym and 1994 elementary addition for grades 3-6 will stay. (Note: Pre-school through 2nd grade is in the Jackson school building.) The current band and weight room will become an art and community wellness center. Most of these rooms will be remodeled in some way. This phase is scheduled to be completed in January, 2012.

The Ponca Community Educational Foundation (PCEF) believes that a strong school district needs a strong Fine Arts area. When bids were received for the needed improvements, increased costs necessitated the removal of various items in the new Fine Arts area (the 1939 gym). The PCEF has undertaken the goal of raising \$125,000 to finish the Fine Arts area. This includes: sound & lighting systems, telescopic seating, stage curtains, diffusers, chairs, risers and storage units for the chairs and risers. The goal is to present the School Board with a check by January 17, 2011, at the annual PCEF meeting, to fund these necessary purchases.

Were you involved in band, choir, concerts, conference and district music contests, solos, swing choir, speech, one-act play, school plays, or community musicals when you were a student at Ponca Public Schools? *Now is the time, to help make a difference!* We and the twenty member committee helping us, ask that you consider making a donation to help finish the Fine Arts area. You can also make the donation in "honor of" or "in memory of" that person in Ponca, who gave you piano lessons, was your choir instructor, took you to state in one-act, led your band in a half-time show, or a family member who influenced you to participate in Fine Arts when you were in school. All donations are tax deductible and will be acknowledged in the PCEF's brochure in May, 2011.


