From the Desk of the Superintendent

Invitation to Parent Meeting - In recent years, educators have spent considerable time dealing with the issues of technology in our schools. Unfortunately, these efforts have dealt with the improper and misuse of these tools, and not just strictly related to academics. With the cooperation of the District's ministerial association, plans have been made on **Wednesday, October 6th at 7:00 p.m.**, for Ponca Schools to host an open forum for District parents and citizens. This 45-60 minute program will focus on the topics of dating violence, sexting, texting, cell phones, social media websites (Facebook, MySpace), other electronic communications and the influence they have on students and school personnel.

The prevalence and advent of electronic communication has fundamentally changed the way students communicate with one another. This evolution of technology has had an impact on the way school administrators investigate student misconduct in relations to their use, or misuse, in the school environment. Issues of intimidation, harassment, and bullying through electronic sources have not been uncommon. These issues are not necessarily restricted to students. Recent court cases and incidents remind us that it is important for schools, and parents, to investigate allegations of inappropriate relationships between staff and students as well. One of the biggest areas of litigation in recent years, involving electronic media, has seen allegations made by students towards administrators and teachers regarding their personal lives. Posting pictures or passing false or slanderous comments about teachers, administrators and coaches has had an impact on the school environment. Karen Haase, an attorney with the Lincoln law firm of Harding & Schultz, will be presenting at this evening session. Ms. Haase currently represents approximately 150 public school districts regarding student discipline, litigation in federal and state courts, labor relations, and other employment matters. This fall, she is presenting this same message to many school districts in the State of Nebraska.

During the school day on October 6th, Ms. Haase will be meeting with students, faculty, and administrators touching on many of the same topics as her evening session with parents. Sessions have been developed for Ms. Haase to meet with students in grades 6 -9 at one time, and with students 10 -12 at another. She will be meeting with faculty after school.

This is an open invitation for anyone to attend the evening session with Ms Haase. The information is vital to understanding what impact electronic media can have on the school environment and whether such use, or misuse, is illegal in the eyes of the law.

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DISTRICT EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

District to Practice Emergency Drills - Thursday, October 28th, students and faculty in the District will be busy practicing several different emergency drill procedures. The purpose of these drill procedures is, of course, student/faculty safety and the awareness of what to do in case of certain emergency situations. On the 28th, the District will practice the following drills:

Fire Drill – School Districts are required by the State of Nebraska to practice fire emergency drills at least once a month during the school year. Students practice a safe and orderly exit from the building to escape the dangers of a potential fire.

Lock-Down Drill – The District has two levels of Lock-Down, both of which will be conducted on October 28th.

Level I: Intruder in the Building.

Level II: Reported Danger in the Area.

During the practice for both of these drills, students are not allowed to leave their classroom, nor do they evacuate the building. Students are confined to their classroom until the threat ceases to exist. Law enforcement will be involved with both of these drills.

Evacuation Drill – When the danger or threat to safety is within the school building itself, (i.e: bomb threat, chemical spill) students may be evacuated to a pre-designated off-school safe site within the community. The District has designated the following:

Jackson Elementary: Faculty and students will evacuate to Providence Hall. Mr. Hayes and Mrs. Hill will serve as contacts at Providence Hall.

Ponca Elementary (Grades 3-6): Students and faculty will evacuate to the Ponca Community Center. Mrs. Anderson and Mrs. Burrell will serve as contacts at this location.

Ponca High School (Grades 7-9): Students will evacuate to the Ponca Methodist Church. Mr. Gehring and Mrs. Hansen will serve as contact personnel at this location.

Ponca High School (Grades 10-12): Students will evacuate to Christ The King Church. Mr. Brandt and Mrs. Larsen will serve as contacts at this location.

Teachers will accompany students to these sites, providing supervision and taking attendance to insure that all students are accounted for during the drills.

An important element for the District and school personnel with all these drills is the element of accountability. It is important that we can account for the presence of each and every student at the time of these emergency drills. The purpose of these practice drills is to accustom students to what is expected of them, and the importance of following instructions and expectations during an emergency situation.

The Ponca School District has developed a Crisis/Safety Management Plan. This plan outlines the details and procedures for emergency situations that may arise in the District. On October 22nd, faculty will review the Management Plan and prepare for the upcoming school-wide drills. Teachers will review and prepare the students for the actual drills through class meetings. On **October 28th**, you will see groups of students going through these practice procedure on school grounds and at evacuation sites within the community. On November 1st, faculty will meet to debrief and review the practice drills.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION CONTINUED.....

Hot Lunch Verification Requirement - One of the requirements for the Ponca Public School District to take part in the federal government's free and reduced price meal program is to conduct a verification process of selected applicants. Simply put, verification is the confirmation of eligibility for free and reduced price meals under the rules of the National School Lunch Program.

The verification process must include either the confirmation of a family's income eligibility or confirmation that a child is included in a household certified to receive benefits from food stamps or other state or federal programs. Even though families did submit documentation of eligibility with their initial application, additional documentation is required for the verification process.

Three (3) percent of the total approved applications received by the District on October 1st are required to be verified. Applications chosen for verification are done so through a random sampling process. The District will notify families chosen for verification by mail beginning in early October. According to federal guidelines, the verification process must be completed by November 15th.

By the time you read this your child will have brought home a first quarter Midterm Report, Parent/Teacher conferences will have taken place and we will be closing in on the end of the first quarter. First quarter report cards will be given to students on October 21. If your child fails to bring home a report card you can check his/her grades on PowerSchool or call the school and a copy of the report card will be mailed.

Homework Club meets each Tuesday and Thursday after school from 3:35-4:30 for students in grades 5-12. Several students have already taken advantage of this opportunity. Students attending homework club have an opportunity to work on their assignments, study independently or with a buddy for tests and get help from a teacher if needed. A teacher may also assign a student to Homework Club to complete late or missing assignments. We are fortunate to have Ms. Ryan and Mrs. Lowe as our regular Homework Club teachers. They both have worked with students in our after school academic assistant programs for several year and we greatly appreciate their dedication and investment in our students.

The last week in October we will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week. The Red Ribbon Committee has been meeting and planning several activities to promote drug free and healthy life styles with our students. Red Ribbon Week originated as a tribute to Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" S. Camarena, a narcotics agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration. In 1985, Mr. Camarena was kidnapped and murdered by drug traffickers in Guadalajara, Mexico. Kiki's death enraged many Americans in his hometown of Calexico, California, and they began to wear red ribbons to commemorate his sacrifice. The anti-drug message spread quickly, and in 1988, the National Family Partnership took the Red Ribbon Celebration nationwide. The focus of the celebration is to educate individuals, families, and communities on the destructive effects of drugs and the positive life choices available.

Jackson Elementary News

Notes from Principal Bob Hayes,

The first month of school has passed and everything is going smoothly. The students and staff have settled into their routines and everyone is working hard. Midterm grades have been sent and Halloween decorations are popping up around the building, October must be here.

As the weather begins to change indoor activities become more prevalent. Organizations and individuals wanting to use the school building should make sure their events are on the school calendar and they have the school usage forms filled out in advance.

The end of the first quarter is Friday, October 15th. Parent-Teacher Conferences are scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 4th from 4:00 to 7:30pm. Please make every effort to attend the conferences; it is one of the best ways to stay informed about your child's education.

The Hy Vee receipt program has been very good to us the past couple of years. We have received nearly \$900 dollars from the program. The proceeds from this program have purchased books, playground equipment, and help fund our spring field trip. Please save your receipts and bring them to school.

Even though school is going smoothly there are some areas that need to be tweaked. We are still having a problem with students remaining on the school grounds after school is dismissed for the day. School is dismissed in Jackson at 3:10 and in Ponca at 3:25. The school premises are monitored until approximately 3:20 in Jackson and 3:35 in Ponca. After 3:20 and 3:35 the teachers have other responsibilities to take care of. Students remaining on the grounds after 3:20 and 3:35 are not supervised and injuries can happen. When school is dismissed students should leave the premises in a timely manner. If you are going to be late to pick students up after school, if possible, please call or make appropriate arrangements.

Another area of concern is tardy students. Please make an effort to make sure your children are on time for school. Please remember students can enter the building at 8:15am in Jackson and 8:10am in Ponca. School begins at 8:25am in Jackson and 8:15am in Ponca. Students cannot enter either building before 8:00am. This helps to teach them responsibility and punctuality, two areas necessary to being successful in school and society.

We have a growing concern about the students' breakfasts and cold lunches. It seems there are a number of students coming to school without breakfast and then about midmorning are asking for something to eat. Please make sure your child eats breakfast before coming to school. We have noticed students with cold lunches are not eating very healthily, for example a student recently brought chips and a soda pop. Please make sure your child has a healthy, nutritious lunch. Soda pop is not allowed for lunch!

Please check into the office when entering the building. We are having problems with parents entering the building without checking in. We are trying to make sure our buildings are safe and secure. Checking into the building helps us keep track of who is in the building. Please pick up your children outside the building when school is dismissed there is enough congestion in the halls without adding more people.

We are having a problem with the 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students dressing for physical education classes. They have been warned multiple times and we are still seeing the problem. The PE teachers have been instructed to give students a "0" for not participating in PE each day the student does not dress. Students that do not dress will be required to make-up PE classes after school on Thursdays to earn back some credit. If your child is ill or injured please send a note to excuse them for the day and no make-up will be required.

P.S.A.T. Test for Juniors

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) is scheduled for the morning of Wednesday, October 13, 2010.

This test is administered annually through the guidance office to those juniors who have voluntarily registered (and paid) for it. The purpose of the PSAT is twofold: 1. The test is designed for students who plan to enroll in a four-year college. It provides them with practice for the Scholastic Aptitude Test-S.A.T. (a college entrance test) which they may take during their senior year. 2. The PSAT serves as a pre-determinant in qualifying for the National Merit Scholarship. In the event a student scores high enough on the PSAT he/she is then eligible to apply for the National Merit Scholarship. If your son or daughter has registered for the PSAT, please remind them that a good night's sleep and breakfast prior to the test are helpful test-taking tips over which they have control! If you have questions or comments concerning the PSAT contact Mrs. Hassler at the school.

PLAN Test for Sophomores

The PLAN Test is scheduled for the morning of Tuesday, October 5, 2010. This test is administered annually through the guidance office to all sophomores at P.H.S. The purpose of the PLAN is twofold: 1. The PLAN is designed as a practice test for those sophomores who consider enrolling in college following high school graduation. This test provides sophomores with practice for the American College Test (A.C.T.) which they may take as juniors or seniors. Four-year colleges in the Midwest require A.C.T. scores as one of several entrance requirements. 2. The PLAN provides the student with feedback on his/her study skills and provides him/her with an interest inventory which gives clues to the kinds of occupations he/she might like. This career information is used in a career unit (in English class) during the spring semester. The school pays for the cost of this test. Parents, please remind your son or daughter that a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast prior to test time would be a great benefit to them. 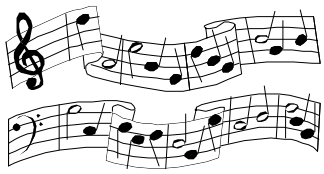

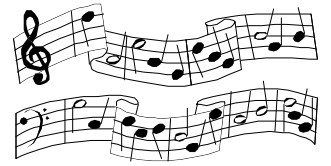
TRI-STATE COLLEGE FAIR

GREAT AMERICAN OPPORTUNITIES

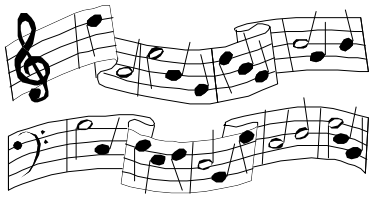

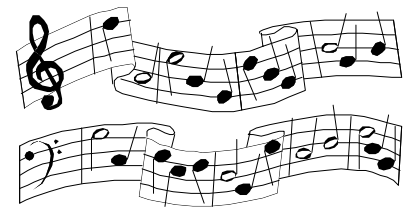

10 tips cut back on sweet treats

MyPyramid Nutrition Education Series **10 tips to cut back on added sugars** 

Cut back on buying foods and beverages with added sugars. If you don't buy them, your kids won't get them very often. Eating too many sweet treats can contribute to tooth decay and overweight. So, it is important for kids, and adults, to limit eating sugary foods and drinks.

- 1** serve small portions
It's not necessary to get rid of all sweets and desserts. Instead, teach your child that a small amount of sweets or a treat can go a long ways. Use smaller bowls, plates, and utensils for your child to eat with. Children can practice serving from small bowls as you help them.
- 2** skip the soda
Soda is high in calories and contains a lot of sugar. Skip the store's soda or sweetened beverage aisle completely. Remind your child that you've already picked out a juice together. Make fresh fruit smoothies together by blending fresh or frozen fruit with fat-free or low-fat milk and yogurt or 100% juice. 
- 3** use the check-out lane that does not display candy
Most grocery stores will have a candy-free check-out lane to help moms out. Waiting in a store line makes it easy for children to ask for the candy or gum that is right in front of their faces to tempt them.
- 4** choose not to offer sweets as rewards
By offering food as a reward for good behavior, children learn to think that some foods are better than other foods. Reward your child with kind words and comforting hugs or non-food items, like stickers, to make them feel special.
- 5** offer fruit for dessert
Serve baked apples, pears, or enjoy a fruit salad. Or, serve yummy frozen juice bars (100% juice) as a healthy option instead of high-fat desserts. 
- 6** make food fun
Sugary foods that are marketed to kids are advertised as "fun foods." Try making nutritious foods fun by preparing them with your child's help and being creative together. Make a smiley face with sliced bananas for eyes, raisins for a nose, and an orange slice for a mouth. Or, cut fruit into fun and easy shapes with cookie cutters.
- 7** encourage children to invent new snacks
Make your own trail mixes from dry cereal, dried fruit, and nuts or seeds. Provide them with a table full of fresh and nutritious foods, and allow children to pick and choose what they want in their "new" innovative snack. 
- 8** name a food your child helps make
Serve "Dawn's Salad" or "Peter's Sweet Potatoes" for dinner. The food will be nutritious and your child will be proud of the meal he or she helped create. They will also be more willing to try new things if they get involved in meal planning.
- 9** play with food
Let your child make towers out of whole-grain crackers or make funny faces on plates with pieces of fruit.
- 10** if meals are not eaten, kids do not need "extras"
Candy or cookies are not replacements for foods not eaten at meal times.
