Information from Joan M. Reznicek, Superintendent of Schools

There is plenty of information in the newsletter concerning the Ponca Elementary **PLAYGROUND**. We have applied for numerous grants to help defray the costs of establishing a new playground for the elementary children. Beth Foulks has included voting information with regards to the Clorox grant in which we could win \$50,000 specified for building a playground. PLEASE VOTE!! Thank you Beth Foulks and Nikki Carnell for working on those grants for us!!!

The flu and cold season has already come upon us at Ponca Public School. Please remember to call Patti in the elementary office or Judy in the high school office by 8:10 a.m. to let the respective office know of your child's absence for the day. Remember, your child must be without a fever for 24 hours before returning to school.

As the weather turns colder, please make sure your elementary child is dressed appropriately for school and recess. Please send gloves, a hat, a heavy coat, snow pants, and snow boots. We will go outside for recess on any day when the wind chill factor is 10 degrees or higher. We will use our best judgment and common sense about the amount of time the students stay outside. If for any reason your child needs to stay in from recess due to sickness, a parent can write a note for ONE DAY ONLY.

Does your high school student have a WINTER SURVIVAL KIT in his/her vehicle??

As the winter season begins, school MAY be dismissed due to inclement weather. Last year, the school purchased the rights to the **SchoolReach System**. The SchoolReach system will call the phone numbers that were given to the school as emergency contact numbers. If the individual does not answer his/her phone, a message will be left on voicemail. The system will also send text messages and emails if so desired. So PLEASE listen to the message or to your voicemail if there is a call from the school when there is inclement weather.

We will continue to issue the weather information to the local television stations concerning late starts, early dismissals, or complete cancellations. If at all possible, I try to make the decision for a late start or to close school in the evening to allow more planning time for parents/guardians.

Notes from the High School

"Red Ribbon Week started in 1985 when Kiki Camarena was killed during a drug investigation. He was trying to stop drug trafficking from Mexico into the United States. Camarena was kidnapped, tortured and killed in 1985. After that happened his community wanted to honor him and started red ribbon week to educate the community on the dangers of drugs. Then in 1988, President Reagan made it a national week.

Ponca students celebrated "Red Ribbon Week" October 22-26. "De-Feet Drugs" was our theme for the week. Students were involved in several activities throughout the week to remind everyone the importance of living a healthy and drug free life. Students decorated classroom doors, decorated feet, wore crazy hair and learned of the dangers associated with abusing drugs.

When it comes to alcohol, tobacco and drug use among children, parents are the greatest prevention tool our community has. Listed below are "Ten Ways to Drug-Proof Your Child" from "We Can Keep Our Kids Drug Free for Life", Parade Magazine, 1/16/00, interview with Gen. Barry McCaffrey.

1. Set a family standard on drug and alcohol use: Tell your children the rules early in grade school and repeat them often. Live by them yourself.
2. Let kids know there are consequences and punishments for violating all family rules, like no car or TV. Make them clear and fair and enforce them.
3. Set aside time every day to talk with your kids about their lives, how they feel, what they think. Listen and care.
4. Help your children establish realistic personal goals in academics, athletics and social life. Then encourage and help them to achieve their goals.
5. Know your children's friends and spend time with them.
6. Get excited about the things your kids care about. Do fun things as a family.
7. Be aware. Find out the warning signs of drug abuse, from physical changes to hostility to loss of interest in school or hobbies, and watch for them.
8. Talk with your children about the future. Discuss responsibilities—yours and theirs.
9. Enjoy your kids. Make your home a happy, positive place.
10. Be a nosy parent. Ask your children questions, know where they are and who they are with. Let your children know you are asking because you love them.

We are excited to show-off our new fine arts theatre on November 19, when we host the Conference One-Act competition. Our One-Act cast under the direction of Jennifer Schindler will be performing "Laffin' School Reunion". The public may attend the Conference One-Act performances on November 19, in the Ponca Fine Arts Performing Center.

School will not be in session on Friday, November 9. The Ponca School faculty will be working on School Improvement in the morning. In the afternoon Chance Buss, NENCAC Prevention Specialist, will present the award winning training program, "Darkness to Light Stewards of Children", which teaches adults how to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.

Elementary News

The first quarter flew by and that means the holiday season is just around the corner!

There is a problem with non-bus students arriving at school before their designated time of arrival. Non-bus students are arriving earlier and earlier as the school year continues. Students in Ponca should not arrive at school before 8:00am and students in Jackson should not arrive before 8:15am.

The Ponca Indian Football team is enjoying a banner season and marching on in the playoffs. Because of game times beginning in the early afternoon or long distances to travel, school could have early dismissals or late starts. Please realize the school does not have much control over the playoff schedule. Please check the school website or notes home from school regarding this information. We will do our best to keep you informed of developments.

With the winter season upon us it is important to be ready for school cancellations, late starts, and early dismissals. Please realize Jackson will follow the Ponca schedule concerning dismissals and cancellations. There will **not** be a separate announcement for Jackson Elementary. If Ponca has a two hour late start, classes in Jackson will begin 15 minutes after the start time in Ponca. Example: Two hour late start in Ponca means school in Ponca will begin at 10:10am which means school in Jackson will begin at 10:25am. If there is an early dismissal, Jackson will dismiss 20 minutes before Ponca. Example: If Ponca is dismissing at 1:30pm, Jackson will dismiss at 1:10pm.

Another winter weather concern is dressing the students appropriately for winter weather. Please make sure students have a coat, some type of snow pants, gloves, and something to cover their ears. The Ponca/Jackson Elementary will be going outside for recess on most days unless the weather is too severe.

We are having a problem with students wanting to stay in from recess because of illness. We understand there are times when students need to stay inside, but please do not abuse this situation. Studies show the fresh air is good for students; it causes them to be more alert and refreshed. If a student is too ill to go out for recess, they might be too ill to be in school. Students are not required to run at recess, they can do a variety of activities that are not strenuous.

As you know the flu season will be here soon. We have experienced a few incidents already with students coming to school sick. If your child is ill please keep them at home until their fever has gone away and they're symptoms have subsided. We will do everything in our power to combat the flu. We sanitize our lockers, desks, door handles, drinking fountains, and rest rooms routinely. We insist on hand washing often and protect against sharing items as much as possible. Please help by keeping your child home when they are feeling under the weather.

HOBY Leadership Workshop

Ponca School Sophomore Parents: Great Leadership Opportunity for your Son or Daughter

It is time for Ponca School to nominate an outstanding sophomore leader to participate in the Hugh O'Brien Youth Leadership (HOBY) Workshop scheduled for May 31 – June 2, 2013, at Hastings College in Hastings, Nebraska.

As the nation's foremost youth leadership development organization — with more than 345,000 alumni — HOBY invites schools from every state in the nation to select a young student (sophomore) to attend a three-day interactive conference on leadership. During the conference students are introduced to distinguished leaders of business, technology, education, arts, science, media, and non-profit. A panel of P.H.S. teachers review and score the applications. The applicant with the highest score is nominated to attend the conference. Ponca School can select the nominee and one alternate.

Ponca Weight Room and West Gym Membership



The Ponca weight room and west gym are available for membership. Below is information regarding hours of usage and guidelines.

Membership contracts need to be turned into Patti Boyle, Elementary Secretary at Ponca Public School. If you have any questions regarding membership, please contact Bob Hayes at (402) 755-5727.

Ponca Weight Room/West Gym Membership Contract

Congratulations on your Membership. Your membership entitles you and your immediate family (college students included) access to the Ponca Weight Room and West Gymnasium from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., on weekends. Use outside of the 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. community access time and on weekends will require the use of your membership fob.

If you access the building with your membership fob, you are responsible for securing the building when leaving. This membership entitles access to the weight room and west gymnasium. Use of any other part of the facility is prohibited and may result in loss of membership. The guidelines listed below provide additional guidance in the proper use and care of this facility.

GUIDELINES: Weight Room and West Gym

1. Sign in before exercising and sign out when finished.
2. Family membership \$100.00 per year. Senior citizen and college membership \$50.00 per year.
3. Check with your doctor before using this facility if there is any question of physical health problems that may be complicated by exercise.
4. Become knowledgeable about safety and correct use of equipment before exercising. (See video for proper instruction and safety.)
5. No food or drink in weight room area.
6. No children under 12 (7th grade) are allowed to use the weight room. Members are allowed to bring one guest with them when using the weight room.
7. When using the free weights in the weight room there must be a spotter present.
8. Be courteous. Limit yourself to no longer than 30 minutes on one piece of equipment.
9. Rack weights and wipe down pads on equipment when finished.
10. Report any problems with facilities and equipment on forms at the front desk.
11. Secure the building if you use it beyond school hours.
12. You must provide adult supervision in the immediate area if you sponsor your children in the weight room or gymnasium.
13. You may be held responsible for any damage resulting from intentional misuse of the facility or equipment or failure to properly secure the facility.
14. Elementary coaches are required to pay a \$10.00 deposit for a fob which is refundable at the end of the season.

I understand there are certain health risks associated with exercise. Therefore, I agree to assume the responsibility for any injury or health problems that may develop as a result of exercise.

I also agree to assist in enforcing the above rules to ensure a safe and well-maintained fitness center. I understand that failure to follow these rules may result in the loss of membership and privilege to the facility.

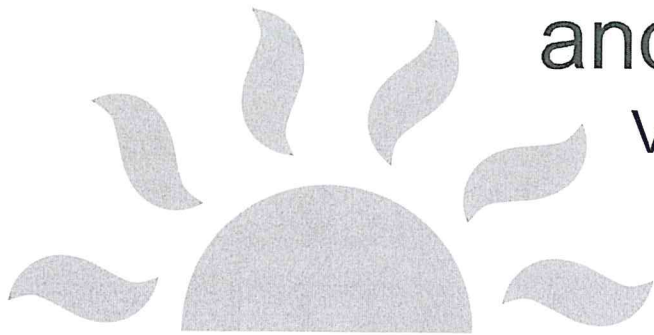

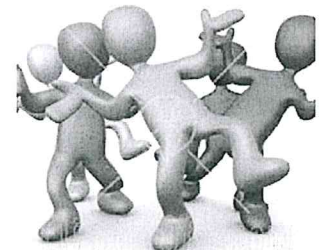
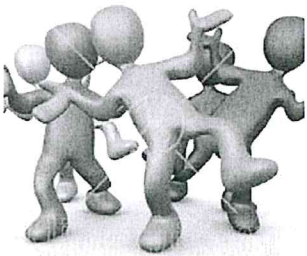

Ponca Public Schools and Ponca Community Educational Foundation to host Fine Arts Showcase Gala

Mark your calendars for Sunday, November 11, 2012, at 4:00 PM to attend the Fine Arts Gala, an event scheduled to showcase the newly renovated Performing Arts Theater at Ponca School.

To recognize and thank the many donors, supporters, and friends of the Fine Arts Fundraising Blitz that the PCEF sponsored in 2010, Ponca Public Schools administrators and the PCEF Board of Directors are hosting an afternoon of entertainment in this beautiful new performing arts facility. From 4:00 PM to 4:30 PM there will be social time with refreshments; then, from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM entertainment and donor recognition has been scheduled. Entertainment includes a demonstration of the sound and lighting systems, vocal and instrumental performances by Ponca School alumni and community members, and there will also be a performance from Ponca School's One Act Play. Historical Note: Ponca volunteers rallied when they learned that Ponca's passage of the 2009 bond issue did not adequately fund the total costs of the new school. One of the resulting cuts to the overall budget was the fine arts program. When the PCEF learned about the required cuts to the new school construction budget, caused by higher than expected bids, Lionel Froseth, current PCEF President, encouraged the PCEF to form a fundraising committee to help finance the fine arts building project. The PCEF's Fine Arts Fundraising Blitz assisted the school district to totally refurbish the 1939 Auditorium as part of Phase II of the 7-12 building project which was finished in time for the 2012 - 2013 school year. The timeline of the Fundraising Blitz was November 21, 2010 (Blitz kick off night) to January 17, 2011 (check presentation to the Ponca School Board). During those two months more than \$127,000 was raised through donations from over 270 donors. With the addition of grant money and in kind donations approximately \$197,000 were used to modernize the 1939 auditorium with new sound and lighting technology, retractable theater style seating, new oak stage floor, sound proof practice and recording rooms, new stage curtain systems, updated storage units and rooms, and renovated office space. A kiln was also purchased for the art department.
