Information from Joan M. Reznicek, Superintendent of Schools

As we continue with the second semester, we believe it is the most important time of the school year with our students in the majority of grade levels taking State assessments (tests) namely the Nebraska State Accountability (**NeSA**) tests for writing, reading, math, and science. During the spring semester from the end of March to the beginning of May, the academic progress of our students is measured in our school district and a ranking of comparison to other school districts in the State is created. Recently, you may have seen in newspapers across the State, the discussion of comparing schools according to the results of the NeSA testing which was completed last spring. The importance of doing well on the NeSA tests is of utmost importance for the status of our school district. We will read about the 2013-2014 NeSA test results next year in the major state newspapers.

How can parents help with the success of the **NeSA** testing??? Make sure your child eats a nutritious breakfast before coming to school, make sure the child gets beneficial sleep, and is positively encouraged to do well when the tests days are scheduled.

Plus, selected grades of students will also take the Measure of Academic Progress (**MAP**) tests. The individual student results are posted to the student as soon as the student completes the test. It is great to hear students report to me the amount of improvement they make in their tests. The **MAP** tests are not our State **NeSA** tests though. We want the students to improve on both tests. All of these assessments are vitally important to the progress of our school.

Why are all of these tests so important?? All of the tests mentioned in the above paragraphs are extremely important for our school district because many of the tests are also connected to Federal and State dollars (resources) for our school district, especially the NeSA assessments. **As a school district, we must have our students take every assessment with extremely high success expectations.** Every student should strive to do their best because it reflects their learning process at Ponca Public Schools.

Will the month of March come in like a lion??? According to the Farmer's Almanac, March is suppose to come in like a lion and will continue to be a snowy, stormy month. The word **blizzard** is used a few times in the almanac for the month of March with snow continuing into the month of April. Time will tell! Make sure we have your correct cell phone number for the **School Reach calling system** especially if you have made any changes lately. ***Remember, if it is snowing and blowing outside with dangerous road conditions and warnings from the weather services; please listen to the phone message first before just dialing the school number. NE-SA TESTING

Ponca teachers are busy getting students ready for their Nebraska State Assessments (NeSA). Secondary teachers are working in teams to schedule review sessions, provide motivators and incentives and to talk to students about the importance of doing their best work on the assessments. Grades 3-8 and 11 students will be scheduled to take the assessments beginning the last week in March and throughout all of April. All assessments are completed electronically. Students in grades 7, 8, and 11 take reading and math assessments. Grades 8 and 11 also take a science assessment.

Prior to the Nebraska State Assessments, students in grades 7-11 will be taking the spring Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments in reading, math, science and language usage. Student scores will reveal student academic growth and also may be used to predict how the student will perform on the NeSA. We challenge all of our students to perform their best on the upcoming assessments!

ELEMENTARY NEWS

March has finally arrived and hopefully warmer temperatures. March is a busy month at Ponca/Jackson Elementary. MAP and NeSA tests will begin and the end of the 3rd quarter has arrived.

We are in a constant battle with the flu. **If your child is not feeling well please do not send them to school.** We have a number of students coming to school running a temperature or complaining of stomach flu before school begins. If your child has vomited the previous evening or the morning of school it's probably an indicator not to send them to school. The standard rule from health care officials is: **a child should be fever free and not vomited for 24 hours before returning to school.** Please make a special effort to check students before they return to school; this will help keep the flu from spreading.

In late March and during the month of April elementary students will be taking their final set of MAP tests and the state required NeSA tests. These are very important tests to help us measure growth and compare how we are doing academically. Parents can help by making sure your children get plenty of rest and eat a good breakfast before coming to school.

The deadline for open enrollment forms is March 15th. The forms must be in the superintendent's office by March 15th, if you wish to open enroll your child into the Ponca School District. Open enrollment is determined on an individual basis and not according to families.

We are still having problems with parents entering the building before school is dismissed. This is a very busy time of the day for students and teachers and sometimes chaotic. Teachers are trying to separate students into bus rider groups, parent pickup groups and walking home students. Please wait for your child outside the building to ease some of the congestion!

Kindergarten roundup will be April 4th. There will be no school for the kindergarten on April 4th. Please check the list in the newsletter, if your potential Kindergarten child is not listed please contact the Jackson Elementary (402-632-4276) so they can be added to the list.

It's time to start thinking about Pre-school. **The Pre-school open house will be Tuesday, April 8th at 6:00pm.** Pre-school students must be 4 years old by July 31st and cannot be kindergarten eligible.

The next School Board meeting is scheduled for March 17th at 7:30pm in Jackson Elementary commons.

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTION FOR THE 2014 – 2015 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2014 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2014-2015 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.

SUMMER DRIVER EDUCATION

Summer Driver Education Sign-up: Driver Education classes will be held at Ponca School starting after school is out in late May. The cost of the class is **\$215.00** for students who are residents of the Ponca school District, and **\$285.00** for non-resident students. Residence is determined by domicile of the parent with primary custody. Driver Education will be held Tuesday, June 3 through Saturday, June 7. The classes will run from 8:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m. at Ponca School.

Requirements in order to register to take Driver Education for the summer of 2014:



1. Enrollment maximum of thirty-five (35) students.
2. Class signup sheet is located in the High School Principal's Office. Sign up by **May 1st**.
3. At time of enrollment, must pay **\$107.50** as deposit for taking class. Remainder due the first day of class.
4. Must be 14 years of age by August 13, 2014.
5. Must be eligible for a Learner's Permit.
6. Oldest students on sign-up sheet will be given preference to take class.
7. Signing up after May 1st, will put your name on the bottom of the list, regardless of age.
8. Mr. Dan Loofe will once again be the instructor for the class.

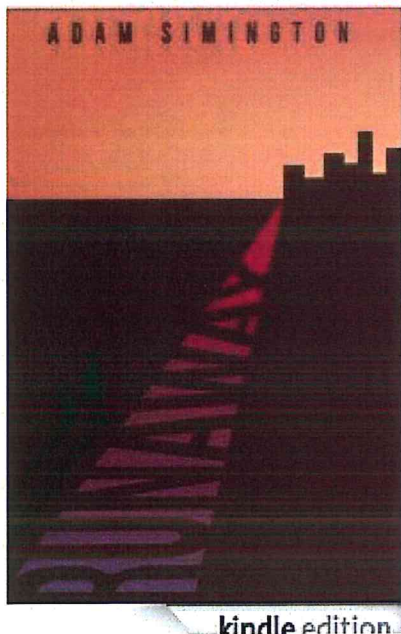

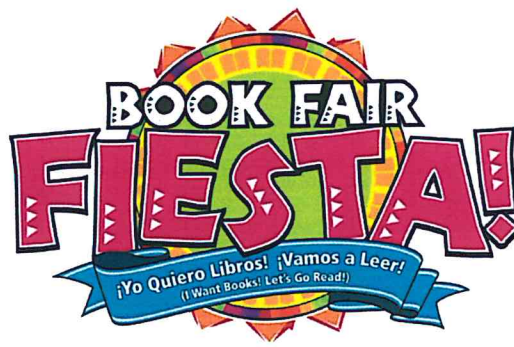

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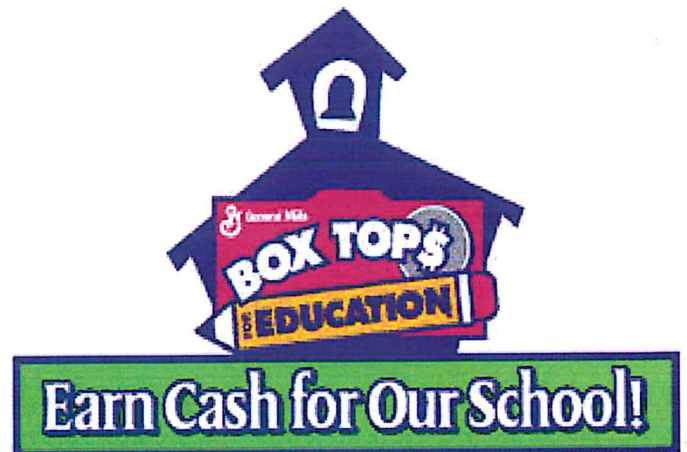

We are still saving HyVee receipts and pop tabs, so send those in too!!





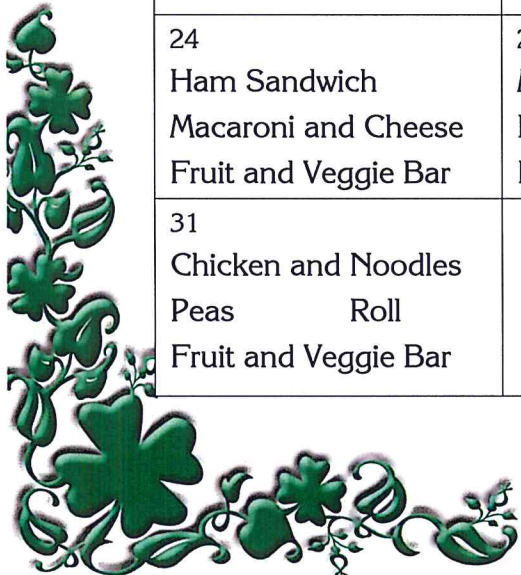
