Funding Opportunities Article (updated: 1-16-2016)

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTION FOR THE 2016 – 2017 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

May 1, 2016 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2016-2017 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted. (If the enrollment option application is filed before March 15th, 2016, the application does not need to be taken to the school the student is leaving.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before May 1 shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before May 1 shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.

Notes from the High School

7-12 GRADES FOR MISSING ASSIGNMENTS ENTERED AS A ZERO. At the beginning of second semester, the 7-12 teachers met to discuss how to handle entering grades in PowerSchool when a student does not submit an assignment by the due date. The goal of the teachers is to be consistent across courses in what is done. The teachers decide that grades for missing assignments would be entered into PowerSchool as a zero. This does not mean the student cannot complete the assignment and submit late for a possible grade reduction. Even if a student is absent the day the assignment is due, it will still be entered as a zero with the understanding the student may submit the assignment in a reasonable amount of time for a grade that is not reduced. By handling missing assignments in this manner, we hope to communicate to students and parents the impact a grade of zero has on the student's grade average for that class and raise the student's level of concern to complete the assignment and submit it to the teacher.

REMINDER TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS . . . Parents and students are reminded that the district only provides for supervision of athletes or participants at school activities scheduled during the school day. Therefore a student who is not on the team, will only be released from school to attend the activity if the student is with a parent or guardian. All students must be pre-excused before 9:00 A.M. the day of the event to attend or participate in a school activity.

MIDDLE OF 3RD QUARTER IS ON THE 3RD. February 3, is the middle of our third quarter. Students will receive their Midterm Reports on February 5. Then on February 11, we hope to see our parents at Parent/Teacher Conferences. Teachers of K-12 students will be available to conference with parents from 2:00-8:00 p.m. that day.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

On Monday, April 4th 2016, at 7:30 PM, new nominees will be recognized and inducted into the Ponca Chapter in a formal National Honor Society Ceremony at the Ponca School Fine Arts Facility.

Ponca Public School's National Honor Society is a local chapter which is established according to the nationwide National Honor Society organization which was founded in 1921 as an organization which would recognize and encourage academic and citizenship qualities in students. National Honor Society continues its traditions in the 21st century.

Membership in National Honor Society is open to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have a cumulative scholastic average of 85 percent or above and who demonstrate the qualities of service, character, and leadership. Students carrying a scholastic average of 85 or above are invited to an informational meeting to learn more about National Honor Society. Only those students who complete and return an information sheet by the deadline will be considered for nomination in the National Honor Society. A faculty council comprised of five teachers reviews and discusses each student's information sheet, attendance and discipline records, and teacher questionnaires. Private ballots are cast by the faculty council, and those students receiving three out of five "yes" votes are then received as members into National Honor Society.

Every year during third quarter, students have the opportunity to be nominated for inductions into Ponca High School's local National Honor Society chapter. Selection guidelines and expectations will be presented to those eligible 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students in an informational meeting on Friday, February 5th during 4th period. In order to be considered for nomination, students must return their completed and signed information sheet to Mrs. Foulks by 4 PM on the last Monday of February, February 29th, 2016. The purpose of PEP is to bring parents of children with disabilities together in an accepting and confidential environment, giving them the opportunity to share ideas, feelings and common concerns, and to obtain information on parenting and educating a child with a disability. A major objective of the weekend is to help parents realize that each is doing the best he/she can do at this time. By the end of the conference, parents will go home with renewed energy, spirit, hope and a desire to work closely with professionals who serve their child so that every child can experience the fullest life.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This conference is open to all Nebraska parents who are raising a child with a verified disability. The child with the disability must have either an active IFSP or IEP.

A small number of openings are reserved for education professionals who serve children with disabilities and are employed in NE school districts. Professionals will experience PEP from a parent perspective.

Enrollment is limited to 110 participants and registration is on a first come, first serve basis.

focus on fruits

10 tips to help you eat more fruits



Eating fruit provides health benefits. People who eat more vegetables and fruits as part of an overall healthy diet are likely to have a reduced risk of some chronic diseases. Fruits provide nutrients vital for health, such as potassium, dietary fiber, vitamin C, and folate (folic acid). Most fruits are naturally low in fat, sodium, and calories. None have cholesterol. Any fruit or 100% fruit juice counts as a part of the Fruit Group. Fruits may be fresh, canned, frozen, or dried, and may be whole, cut-up, or pureed.

keep visible reminders
Keep a bowl of whole fruit on
the table, counter, or in the
refrigerator.

think about taste

Buy fresh fruits in season when they may be less expensive and at their peak flavor. Add fruits to sweeten a recipe.

think about variety
Buy fruits that are dried, frozen, and canned (in water or 100% juice) as well as fresh, so that you always have a supply on hand.

don't forget the fiber
Make most of your choices whole or cut-up fruit,
rather than juice, for the
benefits that dietary fiber provides.

be a good role model
Set a good example for children by eating fruit every day with meals or as snacks.

include fruit at breakfast
At breakfast, top your cereal with
bananas, peaches, or strawberries;
add blueberries to pancakes; drink 100%
orange or grapefruit juice. Or, try a fruit
mixed with fat-free or low-fat yogurt.

try fruit at lunch
At lunch, pack a tangerine, banana, or grapes to eat, or choose fruits from a salad bar. Individual containers of fruits like peaches or applesauce are easy and convenient.

At dinner, add crushed pineapple to coleslaw, or include orange sections, dried cranberries, or grapes in a tossed salad.


Dried fruits make great snacks.

They are easy to carry and store well.


keep fruits safe


