Information from Joan M. Reznicek, Superintendent of Schools

With the eyes of March upon us, we may finally experience some type of winter. This winter has been incredibly mild with very little moisture. <u>During the month of March, snowstorms or blizzards can come so quickly.</u> <u>Please continue to send appropriate coats, hats, and mittens/gloves with your child so they are ready for the quick blasts of storms.</u>

With the thought of March storms, we may again have to use the SchoolReach Emergency Calling System. If you receive a call from the school during the school day when the snow is falling and the roads are getting icy, please listen to your voicemail as SchoolReach will leave the message on your phone. If there is an early dismissal, the school's phone lines are tremendously busy making the necessary calls for transportation, cancellations, and schedule changes, so please listen to your voicemail rather than calling the school. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

<u>The fourth quarter</u> is soon to be upon us and it is the most important grading period of the school year. At times, students may have their thoughts on summer vacation allowing their grades to slide creating a lower grade point average. Help to keep your student focused on their homework and grades in order to help the possibility of future grade-based scholarships.

The 2012-2013 school calendar is included in this newsletter which was approved by the Board of Education at the February 2012 meeting. Notes from Ms. Rinas...

Twenty-one students competed on February 23, 2012, for the top five places to advance to the Dixon County Spelling Bee. It took 26 rounds to decide our 2012 Ponca Spelling Bee Champion. The last 13 rounds were a back and forth spelling battle between the first and second place spellers. In the end 6th grader Carin Mellick spelled "audience" and "sequel" to secure the Ponca School championship title. Joining Carin on February 23, at the Dixon County

Spelling Bee were Ponca school students Timothy Hayes, Alexis Gallardo, Kortney Fethkenher, and Joe Albrecht. Once again the students took a written spelling test. Of the 20 students contending at the county level, only 12 would advance to the oral spelling round. Ponca students Carin Mellick, Timothy Hayes and Alexis Gallardo earned three of the 12 spots. In the end it was Carin who spelled her way to the top and this time earned the



Dixon County Spelling Bee championship trophy. Carin also had the highest score on the written test at the county level. Carin now advances to the Midwest Spelling Bee on Saturday, March 10, 2012, in Omaha.

Congratulations to Jonathan Larsen for qualifying for the Nebraska State Wrestling Tournament in the 126 weight bracket. It takes determination, hard work and dedication to make it to the state level. We are proud of Jonathan for his accomplishments and thank him for representing our school and community at state!

Allen Consolidated School is the 2012 host for the Dixon County Health Fair. The fair will be March 28, and begins at 1:00 p.m. Ponca 9th grade Health and PE students will be attending this event. Secondary students from Wakefield, Newcastle, Allen and Ponca will rotate through four sessions centered on topics for teenagers. The 2012 teen topics are—*Nutrition for Now and for Life, Making Healthy Decisions*, and *Exercise is Important for Athletes and Everyone Else as Well*. Students also will have the opportunity to participate in the various booths and screenings.

Parent Teacher Conferences for students in grades PK-12 are scheduled for Ponca School on March 15, from 2:00-8:00 p.m. The 7-12 conferences will take place in the commons area. We hope you will take time to attend your child's conferences. This is a great opportunity to connect with your child's teachers, ask questions and pick-up your child's third quarter report card. Students + parents + teachers working together make a complete team for student success!

This past November students in grades 3-11 took tests called Measure of Academic Progress. During the week of March 12-16, grades 3-6 students will take MAP tests again. Students in grades 7-11 will take MAP tests the week of March 19-23. We give students MAP tests to determine each student's instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year, and from year to year in the areas of reading, math, general science, and science concepts. Each student will take the tests on a computer. MAP tests are unique in that they adapt to be appropriate for the student's level of learning. As a result, each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude toward testing. With MAP tests, we can administer shorter tests and use less class time while still receiving detailed, accurate information about each student's growth. Students tend to perform better on tests when they do not have to make it up. To insure your child has the best opportunity to demonstrate their instructional level make every effort to insure your child is in attendance at school during MAP testing.



Elementary News





We are in a constant battle with the flu. If your child is not feeling well please do not send them to school. We have a number of students coming to school running a temperature or complaining of stomach flu before school begins. If your child has vomited the previous evening or the morning of school, it's probably an indicator not to send them to school. The standard rule from health care officials is: a child should be fever free and not vomited for 24 hours before returning to school. Please make a special effort to check students before they return to school: this will help keep the flu from spreading.

MAP testing is scheduled for March $26^{\rm th}$ thru the $30^{\rm th}$. The MAP tests are given to the $3^{\rm rd}$ grade through 6th grade. These tests are very important for two reasons: the test will measure your child's ability compared with other students throughout the country and help the school compare how we are doing compared with other schools. It is important your child gets plenty of rest before and during the testing schedule. Children should eat a good breakfast to give them a good start to the day.

Parent-teacher's conferences are scheduled for March 15th. A schedule will be sent home with your child. Report cards for the 3rd quarter can be picked up at parent-teacher conferences. Please be on time for your appointment and be prepared with questions you might have for the teacher. Remember your appointment is 10 minutes, please be prepared!

The deadline for open enrollment forms is March 15th. The forms must be in the superintendent's office by March 15th if you wish to open enroll your child into the Ponca School District. Open enrollment is determined on an individual basis and not according to families.

Kindergarten roundup will be April 5th. There will be no school for the kindergarten on

April 5th.

It's time to start thinking about Pre-school. The Pre-school open house will be Tuesday, April 3rd at 6:00pm.

The next School Board meeting is scheduled for March 19th at 7:30pm in Jackson Elementary commons.

The couple has addressed literally thousands of people, given numerous TV, radio and print interviews, travelled to the White House to meet with the Obamas regarding anti-bullying legislation and been featured in the documentary, *The Bully Project*. Their program is uniquely moving with its message of love, tolerance and hope and resonates with the audience long after it's experienced.

The Smalley's will present to students in grades 5-12 at Ponca School on Thursday, March 29, 2012, at 2:00 PM in the high school gym. That evening a similar presentation will be held for interested parents and community members at 7:00 pm.

Juniors Experience Job Interviews at Ponca School...

10 tips for making healthy foods more fun for children

Encourage children to eat vegetables and fruits by making it fun. Provide healthy ingredients and let kids help with preparation, based on their age and skills. Kids may try foods they avoided in the past if they helped make them.

smoothie creations
Biend fat-free or low-fat yogurt or milk with fruit
pieces and crushed ice. Use fresh, frozen,
canned, and even overripe fruits. Try bananas,
berries, peaches, and/or pineapple. If you
freeze the fruit first, you can even skip
the icel

delicious dippers
kids love to dip their foods. Whip up a quick dip
for veggies with yogurl and seasonings such as
herbs or garlic. Serve with raw vegetables like broccoli,
carrots, or cauliflower. Fruit chunks go great with
a yogurt and cinnamon or vanilla dip.

acterpillar kabobs
Assemble chunks of melon, apple, orange, and pear on skewers for a fruity kabob. For a raw veggie version, use vegetables like zucchini, cucumber, squash, sweet peppers. or tomatoes.

personalized pizzas
Set up a pizza-making station in the kitchen. Use
whole-wheat English mufflins, bagels, or pita bread
as the crust. Have tomato sauce, low-fat cheese, and cut-up
vegetables or fruits for toppings. Let kids choose their own
favorities. Then pop the pizzas into the oven to warm.

fruity peanut butterfly

Start with carrot sticks or celery for the body. Attach wings made of thinly sliced apples with peanut butter and decorate with halved grapes or dried fruit.

frosty fruits
Frozen treats are bound to be popular in the warm months. Just put fresh fruits such as melon chunks in the freezer (rinse first). Make "popsicles" by inserting sticks into peeled bananas and freezing.

bugs on a log
Use celery, cucumber, or carrot sticks as the log and
add peanut butter. Top with dried fruit such as raisins,
cranberries, or cherries, depending on what bugs you want

homemade trail mix

Skip the pre-made trail mix and make your own. Use your favorite nuts and died fruits, such as unsafted peanuts, cashews, walnuts, or sunflower seeds mixed with dried apples, pineapple, cherries, apricots, or raisins. Add whole-grain creals to the mix, too.

potato person

Decorate half a baked potato. Use sliced cherry tornatoes, peas, and low-fat cheese on the potato

Ask your child to name new veggie or fruit creations.
Let them arrange raw veggies or fruits into a fun
shape or design.


PONCA FOURTH GRADERS ATTEND ORPHEUM ORCHESTRA PERFORMANCE


<u>Summer Driver Education Sign-up:</u> Driver Education classes will be held at Ponca School starting after school is out in late May. The cost of the class is \$205.00 for students who are residents of the Ponca school District, and \$275.00 for non-resident students. Residence is determined by domicile of the parent with primary custody. Driver Education will be held Monday, June 4 through Friday, June 8. The classes will run from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.

Requirements in order to register to take Driver Education for the summer of 2012:

- 1. Enrollment maximum of thirty (30) students.
- 2. Class signup sheet is located in the High School Principal's Office. Sign up by May 1st.
- 3. At time of enrollment, must pay \$102.50 as deposit for taking class. Remainder due the first day of class.
- 4. Must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2012.
- 5. Must be eligible for a Learner's Permit.
- 6. Oldest students on sign-up sheet will be given preference to take class.
- 7. Signing up after May 1st, will put your name on the bottom of the list, regardless of age.
- 8. Mr. Dan Loofe will once again be the instructor for the class.


Reading Challenge!

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTIONS FOR THE 2012 – 2013 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2012 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2012-2013 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.
