


How can Students Collaborate Using Kami and Google Classroom?

Kami has many great collaborative tools, such as audio/video/text comments, drawings, shapes, and more.

To allow students to collaborate, you will want them all to receive the same copy of the file in Google Classroom. To do this, you can change the document's editing rights to "Students share one copy."
