## **DISTRICT DESCRIPTION**

The Ponca Public Schools is an accredited PK-12 public school district located in Northeast Nebraska. With an enrollment of approximately 451 students, the district is large enough to offer outstanding educational opportunities and small enough to personalize education for each student. The district is comprised of 2 schools: Jackson School, serving students in grades PK-2 and Ponca School, serving students in grades 3-12. Competent and caring teachers provide outstanding learning opportunities and place high expectations on their classes. Curricular offerings include basic skills instruction for all students and specialized courses in high school. Teachers participate in Professional Learning Communities to focus on individual student outcomes and develop professionally. Technology plays an important part of each teacher's program with computer-assisted reading and math instruction, computer classes, and industrial technology offerings. The district operates a 1:1 initiative with Chromebooks for every student PK-12. The majority of students from Ponca attend two or four-year colleges upon graduation. Extra-curricular activities begin in grade seven and include instrumental and vocal music, a wide variety of athletics, drama, speech, FBLA, and student government. The Ponca Public Schools enjoys positive working relationships with the City of Ponca, Village of Jackson, Village of Waterbury, Village of Martinsburg, Ponca Community Education Foundation, Better Ponca Community Foundation, Ponca State Park, Ponca Athletic Boosters, Ponca Music Boosters, Ponca Area Community Club, Ponca Ministerial Association, Youth Sports Organizations, Ponca Recreation, local businesses, and many individual patrons.

## **SCHOOL NUTRITION**

The Ponca Public Schools operates 2 kitchens (Jackson and Ponca) for the purpose of preparing and serving School Lunch. The Jackson kitchen has 2 staff members and the Ponca kitchen is staffed with 4 employees. The district participated in the Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council's Food Cooperative, which provides for lower food and supply prices through the statewide competitive bidding process. The district averaged 323 meals per day with a total of 56,459 meals served for the 2020-21 school year.

### **IMPROVEMENT GOALS**

The Ponca Public School District utilizes the Frameworks model for school improvement. A School Improvement Team meets regularly and facilitates the direction of teaching and learning in the district. The team meets on a regular basis to review data, explore professional development opportunities, establish goals, and share progress. The School Improvement Team, through a collaborative process established the following goal for the 2021-2022 school year:

- Increase literacy across the curriculum
  - Students will improve reading skills in grades K-12
  - Students will improve writing skills in grades K-12

In addition to the above-mentioned goals, the School Improvement Team, in coordination with the Frameworks model reviewed and developed the following Action Items:

- Develop a plan for technology equipment implementation and rotation in order to improve our practices
- o Research, adapt, and implement an instructional model appropriate to our district
- Improve transparency and communication with stakeholders

### **ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE**

## The 2020-2021 classification and designation of schools and districts are based on 2019-2020 school year data (due to COVID-19 NDE canceled the 2019-2020 NSCAS assessment)

Nebraska statute requires the State Board of Education to create a system of accountability combining multiple indicators of school performance. As such, in 2014, the Nebraska Department of Education, after significant input from stakeholders, developed the **Accountability for a Quality Education System, Today and Tomorrow, or AQUESTT**. AQUESTT represents both an accountability system and a system of support built around six tenets. The six tenents are (1) Assessment, (2) College, Career, and Civic Ready (3) Educator Effectiveness, (4) Educational Opportunities, and Access, (5) Positive Partnerships, Relationships, and Success, (6) Transitions. The Nebraska Department of Education is maintaining the structure and functionality of AQUESTT for classifying schools and districts. All schools and districts are classified as Excellent, Great, Good, or Needs Improvement. While additional indicators may be added at a later time, the metrics used for classification are (1) Status, (2) Growth, Improvement, Non-Proficiency, (3) Progress Towards English Language Proficiency, (4) 4- and 7-Year Cohort Graduation Rate, and (5) Chronic Absenteeism, Science, Evidence-based Analysis. #### 2020-2021 School Year In Review

The 2020-2021 school year will be remembered as the year the students, staff, and parents supported each other through COVID19. The school district continues to operate out of two school buildings. The Jackson School, PreK-2, had an enrollment of 125. Ponca Elementary, grades 3-6<sup>th</sup> had 134 students. The Junior/Senior High School enrolled 193 students, bringing the district total to 452 students.

New faculty members for the 2020-2021 school year included Mrs. Beth Burke, special education teacher for Jackson Elementary. Ms. Hope Knedler joined the staff in Jackson as the music teacher. Mrs. Sadie Voss completed the math department in high school.

The students continued the traditional experiences of Homecoming. This year's King was Kaden Fields and our Queen was Hannah Wahls. The Homecoming dance was a little different as masks were required and only Ponca students were allowed to attend. Later in the year, we held the Snowball dance with the crowning of Thomas Chase as King and Alyssa Crosgrove crowned Queen.

At the completion of our Fall sports season, Ponca was the Conference Champions in volleyball. Brody Taylor competed in the state competition for cross country.

Ponca Public Schools has a long tradition of excellence in sports and academics. Coach Bob Hayes was selected to be the head coach of the Nebraska Coaches Association 2021 All-Star Girls Basketball Blue Team. The NCA All-Star Girls' Basketball Game was played, Monday, July 26th, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. at the Lincoln North Star High School.

In the Spring, the following athletes earned a spot at the State Track and Field competition: Brook Langis in shotput and discus, Evy Krusemark in 100 hurdles, Gracen Evans in the high jump, Addie McGill in the pole vault, Matt Logue in shotput and discus, and Brody Taylor in 1600 & 3200-meter run. The girl's track team ended with the conference track Runner-Up.

On May 8, 2021, Ponca High School graduated 29 seniors at the commencement exercises. Jackson Elementary graduated 32 Pre-School students and they also had 35 graduates from Kindergarten.

The only retirement of the certified staff at the end of the 2020-2021 school year was Mrs. Pat Anderson, Title I teacher. From the classified staff, Ponca has Mr. Caleb Foulks retire in December as our Head of Maintenance. We also had Mr. Grant Jager, bus driver, and Mrs. Karen MacLaren, kitchen help and driver, retire.
